Basket club ran as after school club. Team reached final at Northumbria University Sports Central again and lost 2-1 in the final to Preston Grange. Our third year in a row, we have reached the finals. New community link with Tyne Met basketball club and promoting club to children in school. |
| White Lines on the grass   | £200   | From April, North Tyneside Council provided white lines for 4 lane 70 metre sprint with a line across at the 50m mark. This encouraged children to be more active a break times and also provided the basis of an improved School Games Sports Day.   |
| Transport for Competitions                                       | £797   | Transportation for pupils to take part in tournaments including the Swimming Gala and Skipping final events which is continuing to develop positive attitudes and engagement in participating in different sports. Children are much more confident to take part in events. Increased attendance with 75 attendees at School Games events.  |
| Storage boxes to aid access of equipment for staff and children. | £427   | Most of the PE equipment has been moved to the Sports Hall. New storage boxes purchased, but these all still require labelling and further improvements for access and hooks on wall for bags to take place in the future.  |
| Skipping Festivals   | £250   | Year 4 are much more active outside and most have purchase their own skipping ropes. Entered festival and achieved personal medals for achievement. Much more skipping taking place on yard and children are teaching each other new techniques. Children won local final and were runners up in the regional final.  |
| CPD Training, including Match<br>Fit                             | £4,350 | Each year group received targeted CPD as planned with the Head Teacher. Year 5 Tag Rugby Year 4 Problem Solving Year 3 Match Fit Year 1-2 Multi-Skills Reception – Ball control   |
| New football goals   | £1,690 | Mark Harrod goals on wheels which can easily be locked and moved from yard to grass to save carrying. Goals delivered and ready to be built.  |
| Staff Professional Development                                   | £180   | 6 Sessions for Year 2 Teacher with Amanda School of Nichole showing how to create a dance for the Dance Festival and to improve confidence for completing independently next year.  |
