PE and Sports Funding Impact 2018 – 2019

Redesdale Primary School has utilised its PE and Sports Grant this year to ensure children receive the effective teaching of a newly developed high quality PE curriculum and the development of new sporting and playtime opportunities. This has increased the children's interest and engagement with the new PE curriculum, a range of new sports and supported the work of our Primary Leaders. We feel it is essential to encourage children to become involved in sports and physical activities, as well as participating in enrichment activities and participating in intra and inter school competitions.

Since the launch of the PE money in 2013/14 the following key impacts can be seen in school.

Outline of Expenditure	Cost	Impact of 2018 - 2019 spending
Hoops 4 Health Roadshow – Newcastle Eagles	£585	Developing Year 5 & 6 children's health awareness and developing new inter competitions through the Eagles basketball competition. Basket club ran as after school club. Lost to Preston Grange in local final. Link continued with Tyne Met basketball club and promoting club to children in school. Several Year 5 children have joined a local club after school to continue their love of the sport.
White Lines on the grass	£208	North Tyneside Council provided white lines for 6 lane 75 metre sprint with a line across at the 50m mark. This encouraged children to be more active a break times and also used for our KS 2 School Games Sports Day. We have also entered our first NT School Games Quad Athletics event and finished rank 3 in the schools which entered, just missing out on the top two places to represent North Tyneside in the regional finals.
Transport for Competitions	£586	Transportation for pupils to take part in tournaments including the Swimming Gala, Outdoor Trail, Hockey and Challenge event, Girls football, Cross Country

		and Skipping final events which is continuing to develop positive attitudes and engagement in participating in different sports. Children are much more confident to take part in events. Increased attendance from 75 attendees in 2017-18 at School Games events to 217 attendees in 2018-19.
First Aid Training for all Staff	£990	First Aid North provided training for 24 staff to gain their first aid at work qualification including paediatric first aid. All staff can now apply first aid for trips, events and during break times.
Skipping Festivals	£250	Year 4 are much more active outside and most have purchased their own skipping ropes. We have entered the skipping festival and won the final. We then came runners up in the area finals. Many children have achieved Gold, Silver or Bronze certificates for their personal achievements and have set themselves a personal challenge. Much more skipping taking place on yard and children are teaching each other new techniques. Children are to be invited to run a club next share to their skills and techniques with their peers.
CPD Training, including Match Fit	£2,850	Each year group received targeted CPD as planned with the Headteacher. Feedback provided by NUFC and from teacher participating. Staff and children have been delivering and using new warm ups and using new ideas for different areas of the curriculum. Further improvements to be added to team teach and feedback from NUFC.
Sports Leaders UK Licence for Primary Leaders Programme + Scheme pack with activity cards.	£442	First year of new programme to continue to develop children's leadership and team skills with Year 4,5 & 6 children. Working on developing ABC's - Attitude, Behaviour and Commitment. 26 children have completed their first year of training and are ready to develop their awards. The scheme to progress each year where children are inspired to earn new awards and to run enrichment activities during and after school. This year children have run an Energy Club during lunchtimes and after school. They have also supported a new running club and our KS1 School Games Day.
Outdoor Shed for promoting more outdoor activities	£886	A new storage space for equipment so that it is more accessible for gardening and den building. This will enable children to access a safe space and understand the importance of storing equipment independently. Children have been able to access easily in club time to support staff encouraging them to look after the equipment.
Equipment to improve Curriculum and Enrichment Activities.	£3,053	Includes safety review of equipment by Sportsafe £147, outdoor rocking boat for Early Years £210, New PE equipment to deliver updated Curriculum £2,064. New hand rings for gymnastics equipment to be made safe and usable £232. High visibility jackets for running club and can which be used for other activities in school. From September 2019 a new curriculum is launched with all equipment available to support. The curriculum provides clear progression in skills from Early Years to Year 6.
Staff Professional Development	£360	6 Sessions for Reception teachers for Yogabugs so that this can be introduced in Literacy and PE to

		encourage children to listen, to be focused and more engaged in lessons. Staff feedback was very positive and they are able to deliver more activities independently in school.
Barriers to separate areas on the yard.	£1,217	Reduced number of instances on yard with children running across multi-sport pitches and roadway. Provides a safer area for children to play when being active. Feedback from lunch time staff has been very positive.
Outdoor Classroom Shelter (50% contribution)	£5,000	Provides a good area for children to access during playtimes and after completing the daily mile activity. Teachers are also using the classroom for a focal point for outdoor lessons as a starting and meeting point to make other lessons more active. The whole school have been using the outdoor classroom since its installation which has been very encouraging. The shelter is also used for the development of the OAA programme, encouraging reflection and rest times to support mental health.
Three Apple Education iPads from Jigsaw	£885	<i>New Apple iPads to record evidence using See-saw for intra competitions and PE evidence and PE plans. All teachers now have the ability to upload evidence quickly and easily for evidence towards the School Games Award to help achieve our gold target (currently silver). Staff should also be able to post to school website and Twitter to promote #schoolgames #personalchallenge #RedesdalePE. A significant improvement on staff recording evidence for PE but further training required to highlight improvements needed.</i>
PE Co-ordinator cover	£195	<i>Co-ordinator development time to review registers and to update reports and target children to be active and out of class to run School Games Day. Time also provided to complete audit of store rooms and to check equipment available matches to curriculum. A new curriculum overview has been set up and time to plan CPD for staff with NUFC.</i>

School Swimming Outcomes 2018-19

As part of the requirements of the PE Funding we are required to report on the number of children who have met the national curriculum requirement to :-

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situation

At Redesdale Primary School our children in Year 4 attend a block swimming programme with children attending swimming one hour daily, for a four week period.
