### **PE and Sports Funding Impact 2019 – 2020**

Redesdale Primary School has utilised its PE and Sports Grant this year to ensure children receive the effective teaching of a newly developed high-quality PE curriculum and the development of new sporting and playtime opportunities. This has increased the children's interest and engagement with the new PE curriculum, a range of new sports and supported the work of our Primary Leaders. We feel it is essential to encourage children to become involved in sports and physical activities, as well as participating in enrichment activities and participating in intra and inter school competitions.

The data for the table below is up to Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March 2020 as this is the last week enrichment clubs took place due to the Coronavirus school closures. The data for 2018-19 has been revised to the equivalent week so that the data shows a fairer comparison.

Outline of Expenditure	Cost	Impact of 2019 - 2020 spending
Hoops 4 Health Roadshow – Newcastle Eagles	£600	Developing Year 5 & 6 children's health awareness and developing new inter competitions through the Eagles basketball competition. Basketball club ran as after school club. We lost to Monkhouse Primary at the regional semi-finals at the new Eagles Community Area. The link has developed further with more than 6 children now attending the Tyne Met basketball club. Children have also been asking for us to develop an outdoor basketball area which the School Council are investigating as part of their ideas to improve the school playground to encourage more children to be active.
Transport for Competitions	£825	Transportation for pupils to take part in tournaments including football leagues and tournaments for girls and boys teams, the Cross Country festival which continues to develop positive attitudes towards running and developing stamina for the daily mile in school, Sports-hall Athletics Festival. Due to

		COVID19 the events from March 2020 were all cancelled so the number of attendees has fallen this year. In 2018-19 we had 217 children attend events, and in 2019-20 we had 149 attendees, down 31%. However, if all the planned events had taken place, we would have continued to grow our participation in Inter School events.
Supply costs to cover staff taking children to tournaments	£272	Staff have been able to attend events, supporting and guiding children. Improved results at the Cross Country, Girls football team reached the final of both tournaments and the boys football team reached the semi-final.
After School Enrichment Clubs	£120	To encourage children to attend the Judo Initiative the school contributed £5 per child which was the difference between the normal cost of clubs.
Skipping Festivals	£415	Year 4 are much more active outside and most have purchased their own skipping ropes. We entered the skipping festival and won the group final. We then came runners up in the area finals. The class achieved a record number of gold and silver certificates for their personal achievements. Skipping has continued to be a central part of their playtime activity, maintaining children being more active on the playground at playtimes. Children are to be invited to run a club next year and in PE to share to their skills and techniques with their peers.
CPD Training, including Match Fit	£6,500	Each year group received targeted CPD as planned with the Deputy Head Teacher. Feedback provided by NUFC and from teacher participating. Staff should have notes on iPads to be able to lead activities next year.
Equipment to improve Curriculum and Enrichment Activities.	£3,077	As we now have 3 football teams in school, two boys and one girls, new football kits have been purchased costing £683. New yoga mats at £315 to help develop mindfulness and relaxation activities across school, New equipment to continue to deliver our PE curriculum to a high standard £900, new gymnastics mats £1,180.
Health and safety	£1,323	Equipment health and safety checks £111, storage bins for equipment £173, wood for new shelves £60, new doors to PE cupboard to improve lifetime of equipment £980.
Staff Professional Development	£195	A member of staff attended the Primary Teachers Award for a day and a half and will feed back new ideas from this training to benefit all staff. The trainer from this course has also offered to come into school to run further training.
PE Co-ordinator cover	£279	Co-ordinator development time to review registers and to update reports and target children for enrichment activities in school. Time also provided to complete audit of storerooms and to check equipment available matches to curriculum. Time to develop the key progression skills.

### **School Swimming Outcomes 2019-20**

As part of the requirements of the PE Funding we are required to report on the number of children who have met the national curriculum requirement to :-

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situation

At Redesdale Primary School our children in Year 4 would normally attend a block swimming programme with pupils attending swimming one hour daily, for a four week period. Unfortunately, due to the COVID-19 pandemic and lockdown March 2020, swimming was cancelled and swimming pools were closed before our swimming block could take place. We will liaise with our swimming providers to re-arrange when possible.
