PE and Sports Funding Impact 2022 - 2023

Redesdale Primary School has utilised its PE and Sports Grant this year to ensure children receive the effective teaching of a newly developed high-quality PE curriculum and the development of new sporting and playtime opportunities. This has increased the children's interest and engagement with the PE curriculum, a range of new sports and supported the work of our Primary Leaders. We feel it is essential to encourage children to become involved in sports and physical activities, as well as participating in enrichment activities and participating in intra and inter school competitions.
